# FOR YOUTH DEVELOPMENT

The YMCA is committed to nurturing the potential of every child and teen. From cradle to career, the Y empowers young people to lead inspired, successful lives.

## **Youth Sports**

Youth sports programs at the Y has four goals regardless of skill level of each child: Skill Improvement, Knowledge Growth, Character Development and most importantly, FUN! Our programs are focused on giving children an equal opportunity to improve game fundamentals, game knowledge, sportsmanship and teamwork. In 2023, the Racine Family YMCA had 23 different youth sport programs with 1,850 kids participating.

## Young Leaders Academy

Young Leaders Academy is the Y's after school academic support and development program for children in 2nd-12th grade. YLA offers homework assistance, tutoring, leadership group sessions and activities. 78 students had a safe afterschool environment while learning during the 2023 school year.

## **Meal Programs**

Racine has a poverty percentage of 19.8%. The George Bray Neighborhood YMCA Branch serves FREE meals to the community Monday-Thursday in partnership with the DeKoven Center. 1 in 14 people in Wisconsin are food insecure. Ten plus hours per week are dedicated to giving healthy and nutritious meals to the community.

## FOR HEALTHY LIVING

The YMCA aims to improve our nation's health by providing programs and activities that promote overall well-being, no matter where you are on your journey toward better health. And when people feel their best and have fulfilling lifestyles, their communities become stronger too.

## **Group Exercise Programs**

YMCA Group Exercise Programs bring together health seekers of all ages, backgrounds and skill levels in a fun, supportive environment where they move, groove and sweat their way toward better well-being. Highly trained staff develop and lead the programs and often tailor them to the specific needs of their community. The Racine Family YMCA offers 85+ group fitness classes for all ages and fitness levels each week.

## **Exercise for Parkinsons**

More than one million Americans are living with Parkinson's disease and nearly 60,000 new diagnoses occur each year. Our Exercise for Parkinson's class is designed to help individuals with Parkinson's maintain an active and healthy lifestyle. 31 people diagnosed with Parkinson's disease participated in our Exercise for Parkinson's program helping improve their quality of life and reducing their symptoms.

## **LIVESTRONG**

LIVESTRONG is a research-based physical activity and well being program designed to help adult cancer survivors reclaim their total health. 24 cancer survivors participated in our LIVESTRONG program improving confidence, self-esteem and strength.

## **Safety Around Water**

It is a goal of the Aquatics Center to introduce the Safety Around Water initiative to our community. As lucky as we are to live near such a beautiful body of water like Lake Michigan, it is important to remember how treacherous this Great Lake can be. We are dedicated to equipping our community with the knowledge and skills to safely partake in both lake and pool activities. Did you know that drownings are the second leading cause of death in children ages 1–14? These tragedies can happen quickly and when it is least expected, but we believe instilling safe water techniques can greatly impact the confidence our community has around lakes and pools alike. We had 400+ youth learn to be safe around water in 2023 and are looking to add greatly to this number in 2024.

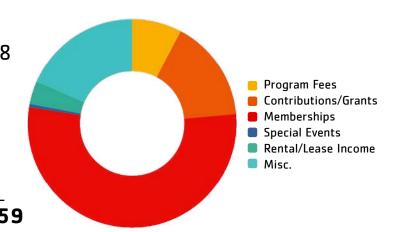
